Bible Readings

Mark 8:1-10, Acts 16:11-15

Sermon Notes

God is love and he can't help but continuously pour out his love and hospitality to all humans. God expresses this love supremely by revealing himself through his son Jesus, who walked the earth demonstrating this love through healing and acts of hospitality such as the feeding of the four thousand. Ultimately, Jesus gave himself totally for us on the cross so that through his death and resurrection all people are loved, accepted and forgiven.

In Revelation 3:20 Jesus promises that he will always be standing at the door knocking; if you hear my voice and open the door I will come in and eat with you.

If we open this door something miraculous happens when we accept the hospitality of God through Jesus. God's love pours in and we are changed.

This change happens because the hospitality of God is amplified by the hospitality of believers. Jesus uses what others bring to come into the lives of other people. Jesus asked his disciples how many loaves they had brought and multiplied them to have compassion on the four

thousand. At Philippi the hospitality of Lydia was used by God to create a new home Church.

Hospitality is an essential calling of all Christians and of God's Church. You need look no further than 1 Timothy 3:2-7 that lists hospitality as an essential of a Church leader and a natural response of all Christians as they reflect the love of God that has poured into their lives. But being hospitable is not easy and like all Holy habits we need to practice this skill and make it a habit of living for Jesus.

However, it is just as important to receive hospitality as well as give it. God wants to bless us through others and it is important to accept the hospitality of others.

Lucy Moore in her book *Messy Hospitality* describes the feeling we are trying to instill in our guests as being satisfyingly hugged!

We have a massive thing to share, God's abundant riches, we may not be one of the regulars at Church or have even been there very long but we can still come alongside and overwhelm our guests.

As individuals when we open up the home we are blessed with and invite others for a meal, we can properly welcome, build relations, reconcile, share and have fellowship with our guests.

Hospitality is holy, it comes from God and we need to get into the habit of offering and receiving it. We may not feel that hospitality and being a great host is something we are gifted with, but we can all do our bit to ensure a great welcome and create opportunities for God to work through our actions.
